# Concept Paper Exploration of 2018 Cooperative Burning Grant Proposal

As you know, the New Mexico Prescribed Fire Council (Fire Council) is interested in promoting the safe and effective use of use of prescribed fire on public and private lands in New Mexico. The Fire Council has recently hosted a series of public education meetings across the state, built and made available to practitioners a Rx fire trailer with the supplies and personal protective equipment needed to implement a burn, and co-hosted the Luera Mountain Prescribed Fire Training exchange (TREX) with The Nature Conservancy, Forest Guild, New Mexico State Land Office, New Mexico State Forestry Division, and other organizations.

As the Fire Council continues to ramp up its capacity across the state it has identified the USFS Collaborative Forest Restoration Program (CFRP) as a potential funding source and way to help the Fire Council achieve its objectives. The Fire Council is interested in applying for CFRP grant to help support various prescribed fire efforts on public lands across the state. We are exploring the possibility of developing a grant proposal that helps fund and supply resources for cooperative prescribed fires and TREX burns on public and state lands across the state (up to 10 projects) We envision this could assist land managers when the host agency does not have sufficient in-house resources to accomplish burns, and that the agency would host the incident by providing provide qualified overhead, and the council would use grant funds to contract qualified resources and equipment( possibly including logistics, operations, planning, and public information) to augment agencies resources when seasonal staff are not available. We are also exploring the possibility that the grant could fund a part time Fire Council program manager to assist with cooperative Rx fire coordination, planning, and implantation.

Currently the Fire Council is seeking to solicit input from land managers and line officers potentially interested in hosting a cooperative burn or in exploring how these models of cooperative Rx fire assistance might be used to benefit different pieces public lands. Ideally we are looking for districts to propose landscape scale shovel ready projects with completed environmental clearances and burn plans. We are currently seeing if we can get enough interest and commitments from federal or state agencies to warrant our investment in the continued development of this collaborative proposal.
