

The High Plains Grasslands Alliance, Hermit's Peak Watershed Alliance and New Mexico Prescribed Fire Council are holding a workshop for the benefit of anyone interested in learning how to use fire as a management tool on private lands.

Using prescribed fire on private lands is often difficult. Many landowners do not have the information, labor, equipment, and expertise necessary to safely and effectively conduct prescribed burns. Experts in the field from the New Mexico Prescribed Fire Council, New Mexico State University, and Highlands University will walk participants through what it takes to prepare, set up, and implement prescribed burns on private lands.
